

Safe Routes, Fillmore outfall projects underway

Wildish Construction has finished the excavation of the water quality swale, including the installation of the outlet and overflow structures and rip rap installation at both ends.

Eighteen inches of specialized loam material will be placed in the bottom and the entire swale will be seeded with a water quality seed mix.

Staff met with South Lane School District to discuss the best option to relocate a fiber optic line.

Crews have begun laying 27-inch storm line from the swale heading east to South Fourth Street. Work will continue down Fillmore Avenue and street excavation will continue toward Triangle Park just north of Fillmore Avenue.

Crews excavated out the new drop off area for Lincoln Middle School students. After excavation has taken place, crews are installing geotextile fabric on the sub-grade and placing and compacting crushed aggregate for a road base.

Next, water line work will be starting at the intersection of South Fourth Street and Grant Avenue.

Area residents are asked to proceed with care. Water line construction will then proceed north on South Fourth Street.

Residents on South Fourth Street and Hayes Avenue will also be seeing a water truck filling up with water for the

coming weeks.

With the warmer weather, residents are warned that dust is expected to become more prevalent.

Finally, Northwest Natural Gas has been relocating their facilities on South Fourth Street north of Taylor Avenue.

Crews will soon be finishing that work and moving onto Taylor Avenue to start work relocating/upgrading lines in that area.

Latest OHA modeling suggests marked rise in COVID-19 transmission

New modeling of the COVID-19 virus shows that COVID-19 is spreading more rapidly in Oregon, according to the latest model released today by the Oregon Health Authority and the Institute for Disease Modeling.

The model, which is based on data through June 18, offers three projections — optimistic, moderate and pessimistic — predicting that daily case levels could rise as much as 20 percentage points.

The modeling assumes that hospitalizations from COVID-19 remain stable and testing remains at its present level of approximately 4,000 a day.

The optimistic scenario with those assumptions suggests the previous modeling increase of June 11 was the result of higher testing and that case counts would remain stable at about 180 per day over the next

month. This is the least likely scenario to occur because it assumes diagnosis of all new cases and presently about one-third of new infections cannot be traced to a known source.

The moderate scenario suggests the rise in cases in the last modeling report was due to increased transmission and expanded testing — and that daily infections of COVID-19 could rise over the next month to more than 900 per day, with daily hospitalizations rising from 8 to 27.

The most pessimistic scenario suggests the rise in cases in the last

modeling report was due entirely to increased transmission and not expanded testing — and that infections could rise to more than 4,800, and hospitalizations could increase to 82 per day.

“We know that COVID-19 is in our communities,” said Dean Sidelinger, MD, Oregon state health officer. “This latest model provides us with a sobering reminder that we all need to guard against continued spread, especially as we continue to reopen and the weather gets warmer.”

Dr. Sidelinger said, “Think hard about your

choice of activities, especially as we get close to the Fourth of July holiday. Ask yourself: how can I reduce my risk and the risk I might pose to people around me?”

He urges people to do what they can to suppress the virus by staying 6 feet away from other people, wearing a mask, avoiding large gatherings and, if you are in a group setting — like a holiday barbeque — stay outside, keep your distance and use a face covering when you’re not eating.

Lastly, wash your hands frequently and stay home if you’re sick.

Loan from A1

The loan program is targeting Cottage Grove-based businesses which have 20 employees or less.

According to the loan’s initial proposal, awardees would pay no interest for the first six months and a “very low

interest” following that, which would cover the costs for Community LendingWorks to run the program, thus ensuring an unbiased third party oversees awards and funding operations.

Ideally, loans which are paid back will return to the pool and will allow the city to use the funding again in case of

any future emergencies.

After the application window closes, with a date yet to be announced, loans will be awarded to businesses that meet the application criteria.

If there are more loan applications than funding available, applications will be selected by lottery for funding.
