

Rainy Day Blues Festival brought sunshine to The Grove Saturday

Award-winning Australian blues performer, Anni Piper, who is recognized as Australia's First Lady of Blues, was one of seven performers showcased at the Rainy Day Blues Society's inaugural Village Blues Festival at the Village Green Resort last Saturday, Aug. 5.

More than 100 fans of blues music gathered in the sunshine and under the shade trees on blankets and lawn chairs in the resort's expansive garden for an all-day blues fest organized by the Eugene-based non-profit organization.

The society's primary mission is preserving and promoting blues music as an important cultural heritage tradition.

Event organizer Vicki Herleman said she was extremely pleased with the turnout and with the beautiful venue for what they plan to be an annual summer event here in Cottage Grove.

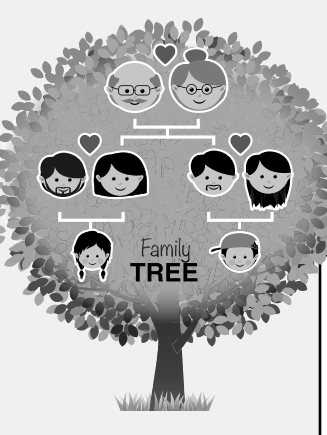

In addition to Piper, other performers included Pacific Northwest Women in Blues, Fret Logic, Jimmy Haggard Band, Lloyd Tolbert Band, Henry Cooper Trio and Froggy, who served as the master of ceremonies.

Money raised after expenses will support the Society's BITS (Blues in the Schools) Program, which introduces blues music to youth and provides them the opportunity to write a song and play an instrument.

"This was a great opportunity, especially at this time, to help lift people's spirits," Herleman said.

What would you do if you lost everything in an instant?

Home Inventory Week is designated to protecting your family by protecting your assets. To recognize the week, the Oregon Division of Financial Regulation encourages Oregonians to do two simple tasks:

1. Build a home inventory
2. Review your insurance coverage

Watch this video to see how easy a home inventory is to build. This simple task will save time, money, and stress following a disaster.

Once your inventory is complete, contact your insurance company or agent to review your policies.

Task 1: Build your home inventory

Follow these easy steps to get started:

Step 1: Take photos of each room in your home. Pay close attention to what's on walls, in closets, and don't forget storage spaces.

Step 2: Write a brief description of each item. Note the make, model, price, and other details that might help when filing a claim.

Tip: Try to group similar items together when taking pictures.

Mobile apps can make creating your home inventory easier. Download myHome Scr.App.book to start building your personal property list.

Task 2: Review your coverage

Discuss your policies with your insurance company or agent.

Make sure you have the right coverage and know what to expect when you file a claim.

PUT TOGETHER A PLAN

Make sure all the pieces are in place to render you and your family prepared in the event of a natural disaster.

- Listen to radio or television newscasts for the latest weather information, and follow all evacuation directions and suggestions.
- Keep a stock of non-perishable food items as well as bottled water on hand inside your home.
- Keep a 72 Hour Kit on hand inside your home that is easy to get to in the event of a disaster.
