Brown said Wednesday.

However, even in extreme-risk counties such as a Lane and neighboring Douglas County, some restrictions will change.

For example, restaurants and bars will be able to reopen for outdoor-only dining, although the state is still encouraging take-out instead. Capacity limits in stores and malls will be capped at 50 percent, down from the current 75 percent.

Church activities will be limited to 25 percent of capacity — or 100 people — whichever is smaller. Extreme risk counties will be subject to many of the current rules invoked under the freeze, with notable differences including the shift in regulations on restaurants and retail establishments. Gyms and other indoor recreation facilities will remain closed in extreme risk counties, but outdoor recreational facilities can operate with a capacity limit of 50 people.

These limits are expected to continue through December at the very least, possibly until a majority of the population is vaccinated; Oregon is expecting to receive roughly 30,000 vaccines next month, with the state's 300,000 health-care workers slated to receive the first rounds of vaccine, Brown said.

The new system classifies counties as one of four

risk categories: extreme, high, moderate and lower. A county's risk category is determined by either the rate or number of newly identified cases within a two-week period or, depending on the county's size, the percentage of positive COVID-19 tests in that period.

With each step down the risk assessment ladder a county is allowed, restrictions ease. For exam-

ple, once an extreme risk county moves down into a high-risk classification, restaurants and bars can serve people indoors — up to 25 percent of their occupancy limit — up to a maximum of 75 people. For counties in the moderate-risk category, restaurants can allow up to 50 percent of its seating capacity, with a maximum of 150 people.

Similarly, limits on in-

door entertainment, such as movie theaters, will see an ease in regulations, as will retail and indoor recreation facilities. But even at the lowest risk level, there will be significant restrictions. Bars and restaurants will still be limited to 50 percent indoor capacity (up to 300 people). Retail stores and indoor places of

worship will remain limited to 75 percent capacity, with outdoor venues capped at a maximum capacity of 300.

The new framework was announced prior to Thanksgiving Day, which marks the official start of the holiday season and, potentially, a continued dramatic spike in confirmed cases of the virus across the state. As Oregon entered the second half of its two-week freeze that began Nov. 18, daily cases, hospitalizations and deaths have continued to rise. On Thanksgiving Day, Lane County an-

nounced another 91 cases of COVID-19, along with one more death — and a single-day state total of 1,514 cases. The day's total also included 15 deaths and a new statewide to-date total of 70,006 confirmed and presumptive cases (as of Nov. 26).

In the 97424 ZIP code, the confirmed case count was at 125 as of Wednesday at noon, with neighboring 97426 ZIP code at 92 cases of the virus.
