Two wounded in shooting near CG Lake

Two people were in the hospital the morning of Feb. 25 after a shooting incident resulted in two adults suffering gunshot wounds at a residence by Cottage Grove Lake.

The incident took place on Shortridge Hill Road in what Lane County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) Sergeant Tim Ware described as a dispute between a landlord and a

tenant. Around 7:50 a.m., a 911 call was placed to LCSO by another tenant of the residence, said Ware.

"We got a call saying there was a female with a gunshot wound at the address," he said. "And before we got there, a male walked out the driveway
