Any new town needs a logo. The Bohemia Mining Days Board will invite two graphic designers to select four logo designs that meet the criteria below, which settlers of the two towns will vote on. The logo with the highest votes becomes that town's official logo.

It will be used on merchandizing to raise money to produce the annual BMD celebration and will be used in the festival's promotional

materials.

Five rules of logo design

- Your logo should reflect your town in a unique and honest way. • Avoid too much detail.
- Your color logo should work well in black and white (one-color printing).
- Make sure your town's logos scalable.
- Your logo should be artistically balanced.

7 basic rules for logo design

A logo must: communicate, be relevant, be memorable, be timeless, should not have superfluous elements, should be technically well crafted and must be

versatile.

- Find inspiration for your design.
- Check out the competition.

- Pick the right typography.

He recently developed a strong interest in fermenting in all its forms. He is also an avid reader and enjoys disc golf when Oregon weather permits.





The City of Cottage Grove Public Works Department will be conducting the annual Tree Limb Pick-Up the weeks of May 3, 2021 and May 17, 2021. Property owners will be responsible for removing any branches or limbs placed in the street after May 21, 2021.

All limbs must be put out **BEFORE** May 3, 2021 for the first pick-up and BEFORE May 17, 2021 for the second pick-up.

Residents can **NOT** place branches in the street where curbside parking does not exist or in bike lanes.

This is strictly a tree limb pick up, nothing other than loose tree limbs or branches will be picked up.
