## Flags lowered to half-staff in recognition of National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Day

SALEM, Ore. — Governor Kate Brown ordered all flags at Oregon public institutions to be flown at

half-staff from sunrise to sunset on Sunday, Oct. 3 in recognition of National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Day.

“Firefighting is often difficult and dangerous work that requires those

who do it to leave those they love and cherish to protect our land, our communities, and fellow

Oregonians,” said Governor Brown. “I am thankful for the dedicated service of these brave men and women. We honor the legacy of those who made the ultimate sacrifice, and Dan and I are keeping their families,

friends, and fellow firefighters in our thoughts.” In accordance with White House flag orders, the first Sunday of October is designated in observance of the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service.

Tuesday, raising the death toll to 274 and the county-wide case count to 25,935.

There were 620 people considered infectious, unchanged from Monday.

There were 57 from Lane County hospitalized, up one from Monday, with 17 in intensive care, unchanged from Monday, and 10 on ventilators, down two from Monday.

Of the 57 Lane County COVID-19 patients hospitalized Tuesday, 80.7 percent, or 46 of the 57, are unvaccinated, Lane County Public Health reported.

On Oct. 5, Lane County reported four deaths and 128 confirmed or presumptive cases of COVID-19 on

## LCC Dental Clinic awarded \$89,020 grant

EUGENE, Ore. — Lane Community College has been awarded an \$89,020 Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration, an agency of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

The grant is part of the agency's Dental Reimbursement Program, which assists institutions with accredited dental or dental hygiene education programs by defraying their unreimbursed costs associated with providing oral health care to people living with HIV.

“LCC has been providing much-needed dental service to local residents living with HIV since 2007,” said LCC Dental Clinic Coordinator Nadine Batya. “These funds will allow us to continue offering hygiene and restorative services including fillings, extractions, bridges, crowns and oral prosthetics (dentures).”

LCC has had a close,

collaborative working relationship with HIV Alliance since 2006, and holds a contract to provide comprehensive oral health care to more than 220 patients living with HIV each year.

Utilizing Ryan White funds, the State of Oregon contracts with individual agencies to provide case management to people living with HIV within each county.

HIV Alliance in Eugene serves clients in 13 Oregon counties ranging from the Central Willamette Valley to Southern Oregon, and the Southern Coast out to Eastern Oregon.

Upon receiving referrals from HIV Alliance, the LCC Dental Clinic reaches out to serve patients from these counties. Clinic staff work closely with the HIV Alliance Case Manager to coordinate patient care, preauthorize treatment, and arrange for transportation needs.

The LCC Dental Clinic, located at 2460 Willamette

Ave. in Eugene, provides the public with patient-centered, comprehensive, preventive and therapeutic dental care, while at the same time providing practical, educational experiences for Dental Hygiene and Dental Assisting students.

The clinic is open to the general public with emphasis on adult patients who have not had regular preventive dental care.

The Health Resources and Services Administration's Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program provides a comprehensive system of HIV primary medical care, essential support services, and medications for low-income people with HIV.

The program funds grants to states, cities, counties, and local community-based organizations to provide care and treatment services to people with HIV to improve health outcomes and reduce HIV transmission among hard-to-reach populations.
