

#### Best bets for weekend fishing

Salmon fishing – coho and Chinook – has been good in rivers along the coast, in the Willamette Valley and in northeast Oregon. Plan to hit the river as water levels start dropping after a major rain event.

Fall can be one of the best seasons of the year for trout fishing.

Some waterbodies in the SW and Willamette zones will be stocked with trout for fall fishing.

Popular fisheries that were stocked heavily in the spring and summer will still have fish available to catch. With cooler temperatures, these holdover fish should be active and hungry as the try to bulk up for the winter.

With recent rains, water levels in rivers and streams are starting to return to normal. Look for trout to be active throughout the fall.

The catch-and-release chum fishery is open in a handful of north coast rivers. Chum is one of five Pacific salmon species and an unusual catch for most salmon anglers.

#### November means elk hunting

General Any Legal Weapon seasons start Saturday with West Cascade Elk and Rocky Mtn second season, followed by Coast Elk seasons the next two Saturdays-plus many controlled elk hunts are happening. Don't forget West Cascade elk is now in November (Nov. 6-12 this year), rather than the middle of Western Oregon deer season, a change made to improve hunt quality. Remember to get your elk tag or redeem your SportsPac voucher by visting myodfw.com/articles/how-buy-license-ortag#How-to-redeem-Sports-Pac-voucher no later than the day before the hunt begins.

The fifth-seeded North Douglas Warriors

volleyball team capped off an historic sea-

son with a win over the second seed St. Paul

Heavy favorite Siuslaw would finish first with 42 points, Sisters would finish second with 88 points, while Cottage Grove and Valley Catholic tied with 93 points. With the first five finishers for Cottage Grove and Valley Catholic tying points, the tiebreaker went to the next finishers for each team. Brennen Murphy and Jace Meyer finishing ahead of the other two Valley Catholic runners. Jayden Owens also finished in the top ten with a 17:09 and Carter Bengston ran the fastest time for freshman at the meet with a 17:11. Other finishers include Ethan Peterson 17:35, Carter Parsons 18:29, Rafael Fields 18:51, Brennen Murphy 19:01, and Jace Meyer 19:02.

# *Lions volleyball bounced by Valley Catholic in quarterfinals*

Sixth seed Cottage Grove traveled to third seed Valley Catholic last Tuesday Nov. 2 after the Lions bounced Tillamook in the first round of the playoffs. The Lions were able to win the first set but Valley Catholic went on to win the next three sets as The Valiants won in four sets over Cottage Grove ending the Lions season.

The first set saw neither team gain more than a five-point lead until later in the set. Junior Blakely Herbert served two aces in a row to break a 17-17 tie giving the Lions a 19-17 lead.

Two more hits would go out for Valley Catholic holding a lead for Cottage Grove at 21-18. Gracie Arnold would make it three points in a row with a hit in forcing the opposing coach to call a timeout with the Lions leading 22-18.

A Cottage Grove block at the net and a hit from Taylor McKay would end the first set in favor of the Lions 25-20.

Valley Catholic would respond in the second set going on a 10-3 scoring run to take a big 18-11 lead over Cottage Grove and not looking back.

Izabell Senters and Mckay scored
