POLICE LOG

Nov. 30

- An officer responded to London School for a report of Burglary and Theft. Staff advised how an outbuilding was broken into sometime between Nov. 26 and Nov. 28, where a lock was broken and school property was taken from the storage building. It was determined ultimately that seven Genesis Bows, 60 arrows and one cordless electric string trimmer were stolen. The officer counseled with staff about improving the buildings security. Approximate total value of the stolen items is \$1,880.

- An officer responded to Walmart to assist a mother whose son who was running from her in the parking lot.

- Officers responded to a death investigation on the 500 block of Landess Road.

Dec. 1

- A collision occurred between a CGPD patrol unit and a city-owned van after the unoccupied patrol until rolled backwards from a parked position near the police station sally port. The patrol unit's engine was reportedly off, but it was determined the transmission had not successfully been placed in park.

Dec. 2

- While on patrol, an officer received a cross report stating that health care providers were concerned about a new mother's "disinterest" in her newborn baby. There were no allegations of neglect and the case was to be assigned and handled by OHS.

Dec. 4

- An officer responded to the Safeway parking lot to assist with an information exchange between two parties. According to the parties' statements, one party pulled into a parking space and struck a shopping cart, causing it to propel into the driver door of the other party. The first party was issued a citation for Driving While Suspended and Failure to Renew Vehicle Registration.

- An individual was taken into custody for an outstanding warrant and was to be housed at the Cottage Grove Municipal Jail until US Marshals were due to come and take the individual

into custody on Dec. 6.

Dec. 5

- An officer was contacted by citizens regarding a unknown male walking onto a porch located on the 1700 block of Pritchett Place, taking four bags of cans and leaving.

- An individual was taken into custody for an outstanding warrant and was to be housed at the Cottage Grove Municipal Jail until US Marshals were due to come and take the individual into custody on Dec. 6. This case involves a separate individual from one in similar circumstances taken into custody on Dec. 4.

- An individual on the 400 block of E Main Street was determined to be in a mental health crisis and transported to the University District Hospital for evaluation and treatment. The individual reported being chased by unknown persons and being attacked by large spiders.

- A CGPD dispatch supervisor advised officers of a driver on I-5 suspected to be intoxicated and provided real-time accounts of the vehicle failing to maintain a lane of travel, driving at slow speeds and cutting off other drivers. The supervisor continued providing updated locations of the vehicle, which subsequently entered Cottage Grove and was pulled over for a traffic stop on the 1200 block of Hwy 99. The officer observed multiple indications of impairment. The driver was arrested and would subsequently voluntarily consent to a blood draw. The driver was cited and released on the charge of Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants.

November 2021 Building Inspection Services report

For the month of November, the Building Division of the Public Works & Development Department issued 75 permits, one for a new single-family home, and performed 173 inspections in Cottage Grove.

In Creswell, 16 permits were issued and 73 inspections were performed.

In Veneta, 11 permits were issued and 36 inspections were performed.

In Cobourg, three permits were issued and 29 inspections were performed. Staff reviewed and approved 17 plan sets in November and 18 plan sets are in review or on hold for additional information.

Construction causes street closures

Meili Construction Company is installing sanitary sewer and storm drainage facilities within the intersection of S 10th Street and Tyler Avenue the week, Dec. 6 through Dec. 10.

The work will require the streets to be closed in this area. Later in the week, it may be possible to have one-lane traffic de-

pending on the progress of the work.

Drivers are asked to avoid this area if possible and plan accordingly to ensure on-time arrival to destinations.
