## MANUFACTURE OF PERFUMES.

A Leading Industry of Southern France for Many Years.

The memory of man does not reach back to the time when the perfume industry was not a leading one in southern France, but few people understand anything of the details of the business or what a vast number of flowers is required to make a few drops of the most delicate and valuable perfumes. The government, in its advance sheets of consular reports, gives an extract from the Revue de Statistique which presents some curious and interesting facts concerning the perfume industry.

In the department of the Maritime Alps in southern France the quantity of blossoms required annually for the manufacture of perfumes, oils, etc., is: Of roses, 4,400,200 pounds; of orange blossoms, 5,511,500 pounds; of jessamine, 440,920 pounds; of cassia blossoms, 330,600 pounds; of tuberose, 330,600 pounds, and of violets, 440,920 pounds. These blossoms are sold by the kilogram (2.2046 pounds) and the prices paid are so astonishingly low as to raise a smile of disgust upon the face of an ordinary flower dealer.

The violets and cassia bring 4 francs (77.2 cents) per kilogram; tuberose 5 francs (90 1/2 cents); jessamine 2 1/2 francs (48.2 cents); roses 65 centimes (12.5 cents); orange blossoms 70 centimes (13.5 cents). The pickers of the flowers can gather, in four hours, 44,092 pounds of roses; 6,06 pounds of jessamine, 13.2 pounds of tuberose and in an entire day 22,046 pounds of violets or orange blossoms.

The preparation of the perfumes requires a vast number of these blossoms. To produce 2,204.6 pounds of essence, 2,204.6 pounds of orange blossoms are demanded, which means, approximately, 1,200,000 separate flowers. For the same quantity of attar of roses about 35,273.6 pounds of roses, or 5,000,000 blossoms, are required. But the aggregate product of the perfume business is large, for the district annually produces 1,102,300 pounds of pomade or oils, the value of which exceeds 15,000,000 francs, or \$2,805,000.—Chicago News.

It has not been a life of endless dinners, cotillions and soirees, but rather one of domesticity, combined with constant association with the people who constitute the polite society of the famous old university town.
