### ADJOURNED MEETING.

Council Proceedings of Adjourned Meeting Thursday Night.

Motion that council extend to representatives of local papers, the courtesy of a seat at clerk's desk in order that they might write up proceedings of council if desired. Carried.

Marshal instructed to notify owners of the old Gowdy stable on west side to secure the doors to said stable in such a manner that they would not be dangerous to passers by and others.

Marshal was also instructed to notify owner of Frederickson property, immediately west of Cottage Grove hotel to rebuild or repair the sidewalk in front of same as may be required.

Marshal instructed to notify owners of property, abutting on the high walk over the slough near the depot to build a railing on south side of said walk.

Committee appointed to examine bond of Wm. Renshaw for saloon license, reported approval of said bond.

Robt. Griffin was instructed to take charge of collection of water rents at once.

Contracts for construction of sewer pipe, digging ditch and laying pipe through premises of T. M. Duke, U. S. Martin and Mr. Condon, with J. C. Stoffer and U. S. Martin, respectively, were read, and on motion the mayor and recorder were instructed and authorized to enter into contract on the part of city with J. C. Stoffer for construction of 220 feet of sewer pipe, in accordance with the contract prepared and submitted to the council by recorder and also to enter into contract with U. S. Martin for the digging of ditch, laying of pipe, etc., in accordance with contract prepared by and submitted to council by recorder.

Recorder instructed to draft ordinance establishing the grade of Fourth street and for letting contract for grading the same, said ordinance to be submitted to council at next meeting thereof.

On motion committee of three consisting of Councilmen Stone, Hawley and Chrisman were appointed to superintend construction of the sewer pipe, digging ditch, laying pipe, erecting curb, etc.

Council adjourned to meet on Thursday, April 20 1899 at 7 o'clock p. m.

I am directed to collect all unpaid poll tax according to see 2835 Hills code which reads as follows:

"The assessor shall require every person to pay his poll taxes of every kind at the time of assessing the same, and in default of such payment the assessor shall immediately give to the sheriff a list of such poll taxes and the sheriff shall immediately collect the same. Also see Sec 2834 and if he cannot find personal property out of which to make the same shall demand such tax from any person who may be indebted to such tax payer and shall collect the same."
