President McKinley has declined the invitation to be present in New York at the reception of the Admiral Dewey. The President showed good judgment and courtesy to the admiral in so doing. The honor should be Dewey's. After the reception the admiral will be President McKinley's guest at the White House.

The Oregonian commenting on the present game law points out a weak point, namely, that while field birds are not only protected by a close season of 10 months each year and a limit to the number to be killed each day by the hunter, ducks are only protected during the close season. The Oregonian asserts that the number of ducks killed by a hunter each day should be limited, stating that in the vicinity of Portland as high as 250 and 300 are bagged by some sportsmen. The point is well taken and should be followed up.

The Guard commenting upon the excellent showing in the matter of tax collections for the year 1899, says: "It has never been equaled in Lane county." Now this is the right spirit. And its a dead certainty that times are better when the Guard admits so much. And still the Guard never fails to get in its wail about the administration, the going to pieces of the country, "the rich growing richer and the poor growing poorer and all that sort of thing." It is to be regretted that some substantial improvement cannot be made in the matter of sewerage in this city. It is the duty of all cities to pay especial attention to sanitary conditions. While it is quite probable that the financial condition of this city at the present time will not admit of much expenditure of funds along this line, and while it is not doubted that Cottage Grove's able administration which is composed of practical and conservative men, are willing, and doing all within their power to advance the city's best interests, the sewerage question should not be lost sight of. In fact it should be agitated, in a spirit of friendliness and good will for the general improvement of all. Proper sanitary conditions are of vital importance. As a stranger said the other day. "In looking over your town I wonder that the general health of your citizens is as good as it is."
