TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION: GENTLEMEN: In the following report I beg to call your attention to the high per cent of attendance on the average number belonging. Little sickness has found us with a regular attendance. The amount of tardy times should be decreased during the following month.

The tables for the High School are in position and nearly all the seats are now in use among the several rooms. A few more improvements from time to time will give us one of the most convenient buildings in the state. Maps and globes are needed in all of the rooms and a large general library, laboratory, etc., are among our hopes for the future.

The enrollment at the close of the first month last year was 231; the following figures show a considerable increase probably due to the growth of our little city.
