CITY ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given, that there will be an annual election held in the City of Cottage Grove, in Lane County, State of Oregon, on Monday the 2nd day of April A. D. 1900, for the purpose of electing the following named officers of the said City of Cottage Grove to-wit: 1 Mayor to serve for the term of one year.

1 Recorder to serve for the term of one year.

1 Treasurer to serve for the term of one year.

1 Marshal to serve for the term of one year, and one Councilman for each of the three (3) wards in said City to serve for the term of 2 years.

At said election, all voters possessing the requisite qualifications are hereby requested to vote upon the following question to-wit:

"Shall the Council of the City of Cottage Grove, be authorized to issue bonds of said City to the amount of \$10,000, at not to exceed 6 per cent interest for the purpose of funding the outstanding bonds of the said City to the amount of \$5,000.00 drawing interest at the rate of 8 per cent and for the purpose of extending the present system of water works throughout the corporate limits of the City of Cottage Grove?"
