East and West Cottage Grove Republican Delegates.

Persuant to the republican primary call, the two Cottage Grove primaries assembled at their respective quarters, Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, March 26. A good attendance was in evidence at both primaries and the best of harmony prevailed.

WEST COTTAGE GROVE

Was called to order in the Masonic hall and Mayor Bristow was elected chairman with Attorney J. E. Young, secretary.

The following delegates were then elected. Darwin Bristow, J. S. Benson, G. W. McReynolds, Joe Powell, H. E. Underwood, W. B. Hawley.

W. B. Hawley was nominated for road supervisor of West Cottage Grove precinct.

EAST COTTAGE GROVE

primary convened with C. J. Howard in the chair, Jas. Hemenway secretary. The following delegates were then nominated and upon ballot were declared duly elected delegates to the county convention: O. F. Knox, C. H. Burkholder, H. Yancy, Wm. Landess, J. H. McFarland, E. L. Doolittle, J. N. Chapman, C. J. Howard.

W. S. Bennett was unanimously nominated for road supervisor of East Cottage Grove road district.

IN JOINT MEETING.

Immediately after the nomination and election of delegates the East precinct primary meeting adjourned to go into joint meeting with the West precinct primary at Masonic hall to nominate a justice of the peace and constable. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bristow at 3 o'clock, Mr. Bristow placing in nomination O. F. Knox for chairman of the joint convention. The motion and election of Mr. Knox to the chair was made unanimous.

Nominations for justice of the peace were first in order and closed on J. W. Vaughn and Robert Griffin. Mr. Vaughn getting a majority of all the votes cast he was declared duly nominated by the chair.

Henry Wagner, R. W. Veatch and Warren McFarland were then nominated for constable. Upon the counting of the ballots Mr. Wagner receiving the majority of all votes cast and was declared nominated.
