

COUSINS ON PORTO RICO.

In a private letter to C. M. Norton of Marshalltown, Iowa, in answer to queries regarding the Porto Rico question Congressman Robert G. Cousins has the following which is taken from the Iowa Times-Republican, in which the entire letter was printed April 3. It may serve to throw some light on the question. Read it:

***"As for the 15 per cent duty, that is a small matter compared with this greater question of the constitution which is at stake. At first, the president thought that free trade would be the best thing for Porto Rico, but later he realized that in their distressed condition money had to be raised to carry on public improvements in the island of Porto Rico. It had to be raised in one of three ways, either by bonding the island, or by direct taxation, which it is acknowledged those people cannot pay, or by placing a small duty upon goods passing to and from the country, and then turning the money so collected back for the benefit of the island. Most of this 15 per cent duty would be paid by the large tobacco and sugar trusts, who have bought up stores of tobacco and sugar in the island, hoping to get it in free. Very little of the duty, if any, would be paid by the average citizen of Porto Rico. If the duty was established it would be collected from these people who are able to pay, and at once turned back; as I have said, for the purpose of building school houses and improving the internal situation in the island. Not one cent, under the provisions of the measure, is to be retained by the United States. In addition to that, more than two millions of dollars have recently been turned over by act of congress, heretofore collected on duties for the benefit of the island. The history of our world reveals no such example of magnanimity to any possession or colony as has been exercised by the United States toward Porto Rico. The president has clearly indicated that he thinks this method of raising revenue for the Porto Ricans is the best, and desires the bill to pass. Personally, I think the 15 per cent duty is of far less importance than the constitutional position contended for, which is, that this government has the right through the representatives of the people, to deal with these new possessions in its discretion, and that the inhabitants of these islands do not come at once into the full rights and privileges that American citizens enjoy under the constitution. It is one thing to show sympathy for a people and quite another thing to provide for them. Would you be willing to bond the island of Porto Rico, or would you favor direct taxation to be placed on those people if you had a knowledge that they are unable to pay a direct tax? If you would not be in favor of either one of these plans, would you favor appropriating directly out of the United States treasury, and taxing our people for all public improvements in Porto Rico? The terms of this 15 per cent bill provide that it is only to extend two years, until such time as the inhabitants can recover from the recent storm devastations, and the coffee and other crops be available so they will be able to bear the expense for their own public improvements. There is much talk about squeezing the poor Porto Rican by levying a small duty in the way of revenue, but how can such a view of it be had when every cent goes back at once for the immediate benefit of the average citizen there, and when the most of it would be paid by rich people who own these vast stores of tobacco and sugar that have been bought up. I am merely pointing out to you the actual situation as it appears. I will be very glad to favor any method to help these people along, but on the constitutional question I am firmly of the opinion that our people would never be willing to consent to grant to the inhabitants

of these islands, including the Philippines, the full constitutional rights and privileges which you enjoy. I think the effect of such a position would be to lose these possessions. I do not believe you will, in the immediate future, look with favor upon the idea of having senators and representatives from the Philippines and other islands. Of course, I do not profess to know, at all, but I am giving you my honest opinion about it, which of course I think you desire and are entitled so. Yours, very truly,
