## Mines and Mining

Devoted to Bohemia Notes and  
Items of general interest to Mining Men.

Ridge Hotel, Aug., 23, 1900.

Ye correspondent has been visiting some of the mines in this locality of late and finds a general air of confidence and prosperity among the prospectors of this part of the great Bohemia. Jas. Miller, of Cottage Grove, is doing his assessment with flattering results. Bill Redanz and many others are here doing their work, and all feel as though Bohemia is taking on new life. Jas. Miller has a solid face of ore in his tunnel about 4 feet wide, very high grade smelting ore. We saw the Jumbo owned by Jack Brumbaugh and Dave Lessee the other day. This ledge is some 80 feet in width, showing copper pyrites, lead and galena. There is ore enough in this mine alone and of sufficient value to keep a smelter running for 10 years to come.

The Jas. Ostrander and Geo. Brumfield claims were next gone over. This property lies about 1 1/2 miles to the north of the Ridge, and is another large body of fine smelting ore, some 18 feet in width. The ore is almost a solid mass of metal, carrying gold, silver and lead.

We next looked through the little mill put up last summer and which is at present being up. It is to be hoped if ever this enterprise is again started they will put in some practical man in charge, for no one living can save fine gold in such a trap as this. No wonder it failed. The Lessee and Lurch mine was next looked at. The face of their tunnel is in some 30 feet and their ledge is a large base body of ore of good smelting value.

Jenks and Lockwood have a group of good claims just east of the Ridge house, on the Annie trail. Their work for the season is done. They have some fine free-milling ore in this tunnel the general character is base. The formation throughout this entire part of camp is andesite and granite of volcanic origin, with little or no slides, showing the country to be in place. Water and timber in abundance and with capital and practical men, this can be made second to none in Bohemia.

Passing on over the ridge one comes nearer to the main mining center. Corner stakes and blazes show the whole region to be taken up. Shafts and prospect holes and tunnels on every side shows that the owners are in earnest about their mode of development. There are many fine groups on down below the Hejens mill little known to the outside world. Notably among them are the Belcher and Bamur owned by Professor Day and Ben Pierson at present undergoing development and showing about 3 feet of fine milling ore, assaying on an average of \$30 per ton. The Mayflower just below the Belcher is operated by an incorporated company under the management of Capt. Ely. This property is in fine condition, showing high grade ore in all its workings, and is some 300 feet in extent. Next is the Slipper, another incorporated company managed by Dr. Oglesby and M. O. Warner. At present there is a force of men blocking out ore for future purposes.

Thompson and Goldmacher are next to the Slipper on the south, and are doing assessment work at present, beginning in a business like manner and gaining depth at the rate of foot for foot.

Next comes the Riverside, showing large bodies of fine smelting ore. Assays from this property show values from \$5 to \$1,300 per ton.

Mineral King joins Riverside on the south and is owned by A. W. Ziniker and Andrew Land who are at present engaged in tapping their ledge at still greater depth. These enterprising gentlemen deserve success, which will surely crown their efforts. The writer was shown certificates of assays from responsible assayers, ranging in values from \$16 to \$455 per ton. They have sufficient ore in sight and of high enough grade to put them above the average man of means if the great State of Oregon only had some mode of reduction whereby ore could be mined and reduced like other states.
