The Oregon state treasury is in a splendid condition. The semi-annual statement of Treasurer Chas. S. Moore, for the six months from July 1, 1900, to December 31, 1900 was filed in the department of state, and that department made its report to the governor. The report shows receipts aggregating \$785,279.08, and disbursements of \$921,599.69. Balance on hand Jan. 1, 1901, \$944,623.40.

The Southern Pacific railroad is abreast of the times with electric headlights for its engines. By merely touching a button the engineer sets the light into play. Each light is of 2000-candle power. It lights the track half a mile ahead only of the engine, while the oil light threw a faint light a few hundred feet in front of the cow-catcher. Anything on the track can be seen sixteen telegraph poles ahead of the engine, far enough away so that the train could be brought to a halt before it reached the object, even if under full speed. The engines are being provided with the apparatus as fast as it can be supplied.
