

James White returned last Friday from Glenwood where he has been for the past few weeks engaged in development work on the White Bros', group of claims at that place. He reports the property showing up better than usual as the work progresses. While there he located the "Oregon" claim, adjoining the Glenwood group. Mr. White left the first of the week for Rossland, B. C., where he goes to follow his occupation as a miner, but will return to Bohemia later on. Jim has the best wishes of a host of miners in Bohemia.

Fingal Hinds has been doing considerable development work on his group of claims at Glenwood for the past two months or more, and we are reliably informed that he has recently uncovered a large body of high grade free milling ore. All of the Glenwood country is admirably situated for mining, having an abundance of wood and water, and below the deep snow line.

At Judson rock the Landess Bros., have just about finished a crosscut tunnel to tap a large vein of ore, which at the depth thus attained will undoubtedly show great values. The boys have been pushing this work all winter and are deserving of success.

W. P. Ely, principal owner in the Mayflower group on Horse Heaven Creek, and who resides at Kelso, Wash., has sold his newspaper, the Cowlitz Valley Journal, and it is understood that he will devote more of his time to developing the Mayflower group, which is known to be one of the richest in Bohemia.

Tom Johnson, a Bohemia pioneer prospector and miner, returned last week from Roseburg where he had been attending court. The years of litigation on his rich Anaconda claim is now at an end and Mr. Johnson is now in lawful and peaceful possession of what was his own these many years. Congratulations.

The Henry Clay group of claims, owned by Messre Whale, Gilbert and Clay, situated about 3 miles south of the Musick mine, now has about 500 feet of tunneling, on a large vein of base ore, assaying from \$13 to \$120 per ton. Surface croppings on this vein shows it to be 60 feet wide, and a 36 foot cross tunnel has been run from the hanging wall which tailed to reach the foot wall. This is supposed to be a very valuable ; operty end the owners, with commendable enterprise, are determined to continue development work in a systematic manner with all possible dispatch.

Last week J. M. Hart sold his "Little Lizzie" claim near the Ridge hotel to Messrs. Geo. W. Lloyd, the mining engineer, and V heeler & Scott, of this place. The Little Lizzie has a well defined ledge, showing a surface assay value of \$26.50 per ton. The new owners will do some development work the coming season.
