Mines and Mining

Devoted to Bohemia Notes and Items of general interest to Mining Men.

Private letters from Spokane confirm the report that the Cougar mine at Granite has just been sold to an eastern syndicate for \$2,000,000 the transfer to be made at once. This is indeed good news for Granite as things will hum here from now on.—Granite Gem.

Prof. F. S. Day and mother of Eugene left Monday for Bohemia. Mr. Day has lately associated with himself a partner and has gone to Bohemia to work on the Belcher property. He expects to open up the property during the next few months with a view of organizing a stock company consisting of St. Louis parties.

Jas. Hemenway last week consummated a deal with F. J. Hard, disposing of his interest consisting of 100,000 shares in the Riverside Gold Mining Company. The property is located on Steamboat in the Bohemia district, and was purchased by Mr. Hard for a Boston company. Considerable work has been done on the property and we understand that extensive development work is to be done on it during the summer.

Mining men in all parts of the state are taking considerable interest in the International Mining Congress to meet at Boise, Idaho, July 23-25. The mayor of each city and town is entitled to name five delegates at large and one additional delegate for each 10,000 population or fraction thereof. The county commissioners are allowed to name five delegates at large and each chamber of commerce five delegates. We understand that the Bohemia district will be represented at the mining congress, and a good display of specimens should by all means be collected together and shipped to Boise where they may be displayed during the meeting, as representatives from all parts of the world will be present and it will be a golden opportunity for the miners to display their methods of work and specimens.

The Bonanza mine, which is located about 20 miles from Baker City, now holds the record of the largest clean-up in one month of any mine in Oregon. The April clean-up amounted to \$65,000 in gold bars, and concentrates worth \$18,000, making a total output for April of \$83,000. The Bonanza mine was recently sold by the Geiser brothers to the Standard Oil people for \$750,000. The last payment was made last week from the gold taken from the mine in April. The owners say that they are satisfied with their purchase to the extent that a million dollars added to the purchase price will not buy it today. Preparations are in progress to more than double the working capacity of the mine, and when this is done, it is said that it will place the Bonanza among the greatest producing mines in the United States. What is said to be a conservative estimate of the mine places its value at \$3,000,000.

FOUNDERS OF OREGON.

The unveiling of the monument at Champoeg last Thursday commemorates a historical event of deep significance to the citizens of Oregon. It was in reality, the observance of the 58th anniversary of the birth of the original Oregon, as on May 2, 1843, the first government in Oregon was organized. The organization of this government was effected at Champoeg, and the site of the building in which the meeting was held has been marked by the monument that was unveiled Thursday to the memory of the 52 men, who voted in favor of organization, and in commemoration of that eventful meeting. Thus this historic ground will be preserved to posterity marked by a shaft of granite recording the birth of original Oregon as a self-governing parcel of the American nation.

Champoeg is situated on the Willamette river several miles below Salem, and it was at this place on the second day of May, 1843, that 102 settlers met for the alleged purpose of devising ways and means of exterminating the ferocious animals that menaced their flocks, but for the real purpose of deciding upon the momentous question of the ownership of the territory and the sovereignty of the United States. Of the 102 men present 52 voted for American sovereignty and of these 52 men but one, Hon. G. X. Matthieu, is alive today. Mr. Matthieu had the honor of unveiling the monument on the spot where he helped to make history 57 years ago.

Gov. T. T. Geer, Hon. H. W. Scott and others delivered addresses, and Rev. P. S. Knight a pioneer of 1853 gave the innovation.
