**POULTRY WISDOM.**

A large amount of experience is more essential than capital. It is no small matter to conduct a poultry plant turning out ten thousand broilers annually, or perhaps caring for several hundred layers. The incubator and brooder are marvelous constructions, threatening to make it unprofitable for a hen to become broody. Like her however, they require a certain amount of attention. The minutest details must be regarded in feeding for eggs. The hens must not be kept too fat or too poor, but always in a good healthy condition. For the amount expended, there is, probably, no live stock paying so large a dividend when properly managed. The average breeder who raises only enough pullets to take the place of the old hens, marketing the surplus cockerels, can allow his fowls greater freedom. They consequently keep in better health, and the loss from disease is trifling compared with when they are massed together. However, in large or small flocks, overcrowding invites disease and reduces growth and egg-production.

It is a mistake to undertake to breed too many varieties. I have made too many mistakes.

**CARROTS.**

Too many farmers do not realize the true value of carrots as a food producer for stock. If not grown as a general crop a few should be cultivated on every farm. The carrot as a food for cows in winter has commendable qualities. It is a wholesome vegetable food for cows and will prove very satisfactory as a butter coloring, and being done by a natural process, saves the busy housewife or butter-maker much time that must be devoted each churning day to some method of artificial coloring.

By those who understand keeping horses in prime condition carrots are considered as an excellent horse food. Some raise objections to the sowing of the seed. But this may be easily managed with the assistance of hand seed drills and wheel hoes. Large areas have been satisfactorily planted in this way and with comparatively less labor than by old methods. If planted in rows wide enough apart they can be cultivated with a plow. Carrots can be raised at less cost than potatoes, and for use on the farm are more valuable, but not as profitable for the market. Carrots are good keepers in the winter, and a little careful storage gives an ever ready food producer for the stock.

**COW PEAS.**

In some parts of the middle-west farmers have had very satisfactory results from the cultivation of cow peas. It requires no attention to the soil, as it will thrive alike on heavy or light soils.

Cow peas cannot, perhaps, be considered a profitable crop so far as market returns are concerned. But they are exceedingly valuable on a farm as an excellent renovator. And farmers too often overlook the fact that soils wear out and need renovating. A little attention in this direction may save or redeem many a worn out farm.

Like clover, the cow pea is a gatherer of nitrogen, shades the soil well in summer, thus assisting nitrification. It has a great root development, enabling it to pump water from below, and with this moisture, mineral matter that may exist in the soil, which is restored to the surface soil when the plant decays. The cow pea may not renovate every worn-out patch of land, but it has performed some remarkable renovations, and farmers would do well to try it on land needing a change.

**THE WEDDING RING.**

A long time ago the wedding ring was worn on the forefinger, and was thickly studded with precious stones. People who have seen the old pictures of the Ma-

onna in Rome will remember that in one or two of them there is a glistening ring on the forefinger of her right hand, but with Christianity came the wearing of the wedding ring on the third finger rather than the first. The old story of there being a vein that runs from that finger to the heart, says the Chicago Tribune, is nonsense. Its use originated in this way: The priest first put it on the thumb, saying: "In the name of the Father;" on the forefinger, adding, "In the name of the Son;" on the second finger, repeating, "In the name of the Holy Ghost," and on the third finger, ending with "Amen," and there it stayed.
