Mines and Mining Devoted to Bohemia Notes and Items of general interest to Mining Men.

The Hiawatha. Supplies are now being hurried into the Hiawatha camp and the management commenced work with a crew of men June 1. Owing to the character of the rock the tunnel is being driven at a good rate of speed and the new pay ore streak is being rapidly opened up, on the strength of which at a meeting of the board of directors held in this city Tuesday, the five-cent stock was ordered to be withdrawn by July 1. Speaking of the new ore streak recalls an incident of last Saturday evening at the company's headquarters in this city. The management had sent in a sack of the ore and when dumped into a big gold pan it was washed off and put upon the ore shelves. In the bottom of the pan was a couple of handfuls of dirt and dust from the ore. In pausing the washings from the rock nearly a spoonful of gold was secured. Anyone doubting this can see for themselves at the company's office.

The Champion. The Champion mine, one of the best known in Bohemia District, which has laid dormant for a number of years came under the control of the Jennings Bros. last winter. Some two months since, work was commenced on the great drift of the mine, and this week Mining Manager H. V. Behne advised a Nugget man that a rich strike of free milling ore was made after drifting 25 feet. The ore is said to be as rich as that of the Helena, which made that mine famous. Mr. Behne states that every pan of the ore leaves an immense yellow streak in the bottom of the pan. A peculiar and very satisfactory thing about this streak of free milling ore is that it is at a far greater depth than any of like character discovered in the Bohemia district, the depth being from 300 to 400 feet. The width of the rich vein is not yet determined, as no crosscut has been made.

Judson Rock—Contract Let. Col Blair, president of the Judson Rock Mining Company, and John Curran, one of the directors, in company with Dan Colton and Ben Curry visited the mine last week, and while there closed a contract with Messrs. Colton and Curry for the driving of a 100-foot tunnel on the big ledge running through the Oversight and Homestake property. This ledge is the one upon which the company has received such rich assays in free gold and is said to be the continuation of the Hiawatha ledge. The company is now arranging for substantial external improvements also, and will build cook and bunk houses, tunnel house, and complete the road from the Judson Rock springs to the mine. The property is magnificently situated and promises to take its place in the front rank of dividend papers in the near future.

Helena No. 2. Helena No. 2 comes to the front this week with a strike on a 3 1/2 foot vein of fine shipping ore. Activity is the word at this camp now. The crew has been materially increased. As soon as lumber can be obtained a residence for Mr. Behne will be constructed as well as a new mess house and office.

Mel Warner, the promoter of the Bohemia smelter was in the city this week; and speaks very flatteringly of the prospects. R. J. Jennings came up from Portland this week and visited the Helena.

Sam Gardner made a rich find just across the Oregon line in California the other day. He picked up a nugget worth \$330. G. H. Stewart and J. A. Banfield, of Grants Pass, recently struck a rich 16-inch vein of solid quartz on their property near that place.
