Mines and Mining Devoted to Bohemia Notes and Items of general interest to Mining Men.

Recent Mining Decisions.

The Nugget is indebted to the Oregon Mining Journal for the following: "A party contesting the validity of a mining location described by reference to other mining claims on the ground that the latter claims have no existence has the burden of showing such fact." Statute et al., vs. Costella, 67 Pac. Rep. (Ariz.) 529. Evidence is an action to quiet title to a mining claim in which the defendant sets up a prior location considered, and held to show that at the time of the defendant's location the claim was already covered by an existing valid location, and was not susceptible of re-location, Shattuck et al., vs. Costella, 67 Pac. Rep. (Ariz.) 529.

Upper Glenwood Property.

D. G. McFarland and Geo. McQueen who with Fingal Hinds own the Lost Treasure and Akanoan claims, known as the Upper Glenwood property, last week bonded their interest to Seattle capitalists, Mr. Hinds retaining his interest and acting as mining manager of the company. The property is highly spoken of by those acquainted with it. About 50 feet of tunnel has been run and an assay of \$79.38 was given on the free milling ore struck in this tunnel. Foreman Albert Zinkler is already on the ground with a force of men and has commenced the season's development work.

General Satisfaction.

R. J. Jennings, office manager and H. V. Behoe, superintendent, of the great consolidated mines of Bohemia, returned Monday morning from Bohemia, accompanied by L. B. Hock, and H. M. Hugh, of Worcester, Mass., and W. D. Burbank, of Portland, Maine, prominent stockholders in the Helena and Musick properties, who have been making a thorough tour of inspection. The reports turned in by these gentlemen is most satisfactory. They say they found things far beyond their expectations.

Musick Starts Up—Pays Dividend.

Mining Manager H. V. Behoe, this week started a day and night shift of men at work in the Musick mine, blocking out ore. He also started the 10-stamp mill to swing day and night, and informs a Nugget man that the company will be able to declare a half-cent per share dividend for this month. The news of the starting up of the Musick mine will be pleasant music (k) to the ears of those who are identified with Bohemia and Cottage Grove, as the operation of that mine has always marked a busy and prosperous year in Bohemia.

Bird Farrier's Good Luck.

Word reaches this city that Bird Farrier, the well known pioneer miner and hunter of Bohemia has made a rich discovery near the Helena mine. Some years ago Mr. Farrier while on a cruise through that section of the camp struck tracings of what he believed to be a rich ledge. Last week he went back and was rewarded by finding the ledge, the surface rock of which assays \$1g, and is said to resemble in every particular the free milling ore of the Helena. Helena No. 1 Dividends.

At Helena No. 2, two shifts of men are being worked on each of the six tunnels, blocking out a high grade of shipping ore. The 10-stamp mill is dropping its stamps continually night and day. The Helena No. 1 has been paying one-half cent dividends per share for 25 months ending with May 31. For the month of June the dividend will be 1 1/2 cents.

The Calapooia Mining & Tunnel Co.—formerly the Champion—will start the 10-stamp mill as soon as needed repairs can be made and supplies placed. This is the property upon which an immense strike of free milling ore was made last week.

Letter From Bohemia.

Bohemia, Ore., June 6, 1902. The many friends of J. B. King, the veteran miner and prospector of Cottage Grove, will be glad to learn that after many years of patient toil and hardships he has at last struck "oil" as he terms it. While doing assessment work on his Black Bear claim he uncovered a fine streak of quartz, the width of which was only about two inches, where found, but further work showed that it rapidly increased in width and at the bottom of the cut a depth of some four or five feet, it is nearly a foot wide. If it continues to gain at its present rate we feel safe in saying that Mr. King will have a solid face of quartz three or four feet more work.

Its richness is something immense, and by pounding a little piece in the mortar and panning it, one can see a string of gold as long as one's finger. The lowest estimate we have heard on its value is \$50 per ton, while some say it runs far up in the hundreds. Mr. King's Black Bear claim is just north of and runs parallel with the Great Northern claim which belongs to S. J. Brund, baker & Johnson and Lauder. The Great Northern is too well known by the people up here and also in the Grove to say anything about its marvelous richness, being too great for our poor pen to describe.

The White Iron claim runs parallel with the Black Bear claim and is also owned by Mr. King and is considered a valuable piece of property. Considerable work has been done on the White Iron and it shows up good, and we feel confident that Mr. King has found what he has been looking for a good many years—a good rich mine.

S. J. Brund who has been working in his long tunnel has just run into an old chute six feet wide which gives a nice little corner of gold in the pan all the way across the ledge and assays from \$10 to \$15 per ton. Mr. Brund has always had great confidence in his property and has run a tunnel five hundred feet at an enormous expense, some of the rock costing \$10 to \$12 per foot to drive, but at last his efforts have been crowned with success and his good judgment substantiated by his recent discovery.
