### Musick-Development Work.

Development work is being steadily pushed on the Musick, resulting already in the opening of a fine body of ore in level No. 2, while in No. 6 the base ore is improving in values rapidly. Every level is being crowded with night and day shifts, and an air of general activity is apparent throughout the entire camp. It is remarked by every mining man that there are more men in the district this year than ever before in the history of the camp.

### Rushing Work—Contractor.

Frank Hughes, contractor now on the Star mine, was in this week on business with Superintendent Behre, relative to the ordering of rails and air pipes for the mine. Mr. Hughes is crowding the work rapidly, and the property is acting very satisfactorily.
