OREGON MINING MEN

A Call for the Mining Men of this State to meet in Convention at Portland.

BOHEMIA WELL REPRESENTED.

The People who are developing Oregon Mineral District to meet under the auspices of Board of Trade.

As a result of recent agitation looking toward a convention of Oregon mining men, says the Oregonian, a call has been issued for such a meeting.

The movement is fostered by J. H. Fisk and George H. Durham who have worked industriously to bring the matter to the attention of the various mining interests of the state.

It is believed that the convention will be attended by from 300 to 500 mining men, and that the results will be highly beneficial to mining in Oregon.

The call sent out by the Board of Trade, with the signatures to it already received, is as follows:

"We the undersigned mining men of Oregon, realizing that the important and highly remunerative industry of mining in the State of Oregon has, during the past few years, been prosecuted with greatly renewed energy and vigor, and that the mining industry of the state is rapidly becoming one of paramount importance, engaging the attention of a large number of our people and calling for the employment of a large amount of professional skill and knowledge and believing further that the time has now arrived when the mining industry of the state of Oregon demands the formation of an association of mining men of the state, to better protect, develop and foster the mineral wealth and resources of Oregon, together with water rights and privileges pertaining thereto and in view of the constant and increasing demand for information relative to the investment of capital in Oregon mines, and also in view of the fact that nearly all lines and branches of business are organized for mutual protection and profit, hereby call a convention of the mining men of the State of Oregon, and respectfully request that representatives of the mining interests in each county of the state of Oregon assemble at Portland, Or., September 7, 1903, at 10 o'clock A. M., in the assembly-room of the Chamber of Commerce building, for the purpose of organizing a Miners' Association of the State of Oregon, adopting a constitution and by-laws and transacting such other business as may be deemed desirable to promote the best interests of the mines and mining industry of the state."
