AS SOME SEE IT.
If there is one lot of truth in the reports of robberies and holdups in Portland as reported by the daily papers it would seem that the city is at the mercy of a band of thugs and thieves, some of whom are wearing the blue coat and brass buttons. There is absolutely no excuse for the savage reign of criminals in a civilized city like Portland and it is a gross injustice to the good citizens of the State of Oregon for the condition now existing to be allowed to continue. One might conclude the reports exaggerated were it not that all three of the dailies concur not only in the reports but in fixing the blame. If the chief of police, the detective force and the police force were combined to commit murder and highway robbery it would be well for the governor to call a special session of the legislature to provide for government of the city by the state at least until the reign of terror is over. Many people throughout the great middle west are looking toward the Pacific coast for homes and they naturally turn toward the daily papers of the cities for information regarding the country in general. It is the province of a daily newspaper to report crime. Consequently they must report to those seeking homes in this country that the metropolis of the great north-west is an unsafe place for civilized people to take up their homes. If this condition prevails in the metropolis and is so reported, what must be the opinion of the people regarding the country in general?
Justice Brewer, of the United States supreme court recently said: "Every man who participates in the lynch- ing or burning of a negro is a murderer pure and simple." Justice Brewer occupies a high position and one which commands the respect, not only of position but of person, of every patriotic citizen of the United States and it comes with pride from a United States supreme judge to brand men as "murderers pure and simple" who follow the impulse of the moment and commit a rash act. The killing of a man woman or child is murder, but it is doubtful whether any man, imbued with that sacred paternal love which makes men and women and even wild beasts give up their lives in defense of their offspring, would charge as murder the destruction of a field who would commit the outrageous act, to which these black devils plead guilty and which a number of them have been caught committing.
