Senate Passes Assay Bill.

The senate on Tuesday passed a bill authorizing the establishment of an assay office at Portland. The bill appropriates \$15,000 for salaries and expenses and authorizes the ap-pointment of assayer and melter at a salary of \$2250 and one chief clerk at \$1400.
