When the thousand or more people who visited the Cemetery on Monday, had completed the decoration of the graves, the gently sloping hill side looked like one immense flower garden.

Win Hawley Jr. while at work near Willwood, got a piece of steel in one of his eyes which flew from a wedge he was using. The injury was so great it was decided best for him to go to Portland and have the eye removed.

Geo. Knowles, of the firm of Knowles & Getty, General Merchandise Merchants of Bohemia, after spending several weeks in Portland and other places in the Willamette Valley, returned to the city Wednesday. He will within a few days go up to the store to be ready for the season trade.

The Southern Pacific is causing considerable work to be done around the depot. Many car loads of gravel are being deposited in the yards and large additions to the side tracks are being made.

Mrs. J. K. Barrett of the city, takes a great interest in the cultivation of roses and has many varieties in her garden. Thursday morning she presented to the Nugget office a beautiful collection. Among them being specimens of the Augusta, Victoria, Mamam Crusha, Francis Kruger, Beauty and Constance, Isabel Sprunt, Admiral Dewey, Jacquinotte, Duchess to Lamar and Pearl of the Garden.

At a meeting of the Common Council Cottage Grove, held May 31st 1904, it was decided by a vote of the members of the Council:

"That the Main sewer terminate on the street at 3rd Street, and that a 10 or 12 inch sewer be laid up 3rd street to the new School house and Y be placed at the termination of the said main sewer." Also "that the sewer extending from junction of Honey street and Kansas Avenue under, beyond and opposite the Railroad tracks of the Southern Pacific and O. & S. E. R. R. Co be cut out and that the same be not constructed at present, and that the main sewer on the East side of the river terminate at the North West corner of the premises of J. K. Barrett, opposite old School house building, and that the plans, specifications and estimates submitted by C. M. Collier, Engineer, be adopted subject to the changes and alterations above mentioned."

On motion duly made and seconded it was ordered that an ordinance be prepared and submitted at the next regular meeting of the City Council authorizing the issuance of Municipal bonds to the City in the amount of \$15,000 to draw interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, to run for the period of 25 years, to be sold at the highest rate of premium and in such lots or blocks as may be required, the same to be designated as Sewer Coupon Bonds of said City, and providing for levying a sufficient amount of tax to meet and pay the annual interest thereon, and after the expiration of 10 years and after the expiration of 10 years a pro rata proportion of the principal sum of said bonds each year and that after the expiration of said term of 25 years that the said fund be placed in a fund to be known as a sinking fund established for the purpose of paying the said principal sum at the expiration of 25 years from the date of the issuance of the said bonds.
