Timely Words For The Horse Breeder

Interest in horse breeding has increased in the southwest until the farmers are now considering the advisability of raising draft horses, says Farm and Ranch of Dallas, Tex. These are the horses for the average farmer to raise for market, since they do not require the special preparation for market in the way of training, etc., that light horses or coach horses do and are less damaged by blennies, which frequently appear, even on colts that are carefully cared for. The draft horse can be broken at the age of two years and made self supporting until he is mature and ready for market. Follow a definite plan in breeding. Every farmer should attempt to produce horses of some definite type such as the market demands, and this can only be done by deciding on the breed or type one cares to raise and then resolutely sticking to it. In speaking of the draft horse Professor Kennedy of the Iowa State college says: The type of draft horse that the market wants is a horse weighing 1,000 pounds or over in ordinary working condition, a deep bodied, broad, close

He should be deep and wide in the chest to insure a rugged constitution, his legs should be well set, with clean, dense bone, sloping pasterns, and his feet should be large, round, wide at the heels and of fair depth, especially at the heels. It is well to remember the old Scotch motto: Feet and legs, bone and feather. For without good feet and legs the best bodied draft horse in the world would be practically useless. Good action is also a prime requisite, for with all other things equal the horse that can walk four miles per hour with ease is of far more value than the one that cannot take this pace, and good action is also invariably associated with a good constitution.

The Cost of a Horse.

A correspondent asks Stockman: How much does it cost to raise a horse? This is a very proper question, and it is one that deserves more consideration than it receives. If every man who breeds a mare would sit down and figure what it will cost him to raise her produce to three years old, he would come to one of two conclusions:—to breed to get a horse of some good all round class or type or not breed at all. But this is not answering our friend's question.

A Giant Missouri Mule.



The illustration shows a mule almost four to five inches at the top, four inches in a key block and straight up, and as at the bottom. I then bounded it up and down with spruce boards round hock and as good, mulling them firmly to the frames. Then I put on tarred paper and another tier of boards, being careful to break joints. In the corner I put another strip of tarred paper and then two narrow strips of board to make them as near air tight as possible. At the bottom, I put nearly a foot of small cobbles and then cemented it, having the cement come well up on the boards at the foot. This lets the water, if any, pass off.

Good Words For the Silo

Six years ago I made a silo in the following manner: I took standard spruce and fir poles from the wood lot four to five inches at the top, four inches at the bottom. I then bounded it up and down with spruce boards round hock and as good, mulling them firmly to the frames. Then I put on tarred paper and another tier of boards, being careful to break joints. In the corner I put another strip of tarred paper and then two narrow strips of board to make them as near air tight as possible. 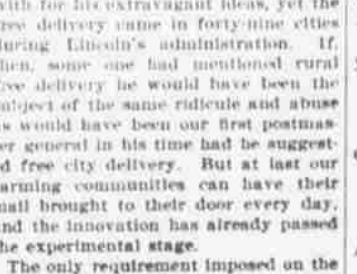
