If you pay your taxes in full, on or before March 15, 1906 you will be allowed a rebate of three per cent. If you pay your taxes between March 15th and the first Monday in April, you will not receive the rebate, neither will there be added penalties and interest. You may pay half of your taxes on or before the first Monday in April, and then have until and including the first Monday in October, 1906, to pay the second half thereof. In case at least one-half of your taxes are not paid on or before the first Monday in April, the entire tax becomes delinquent and the law compels a charge of 10 per cent penalty and interest at the rate of 12 per cent per annum until paid.


