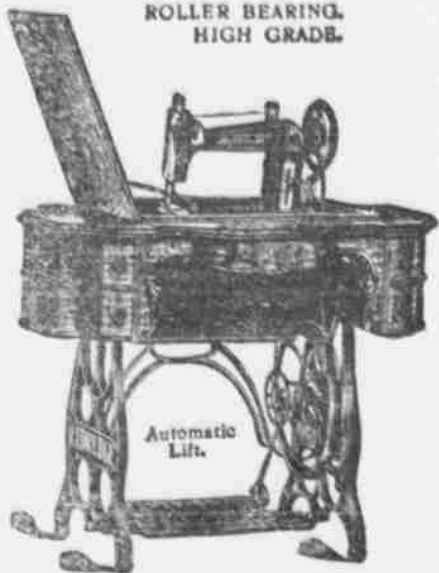

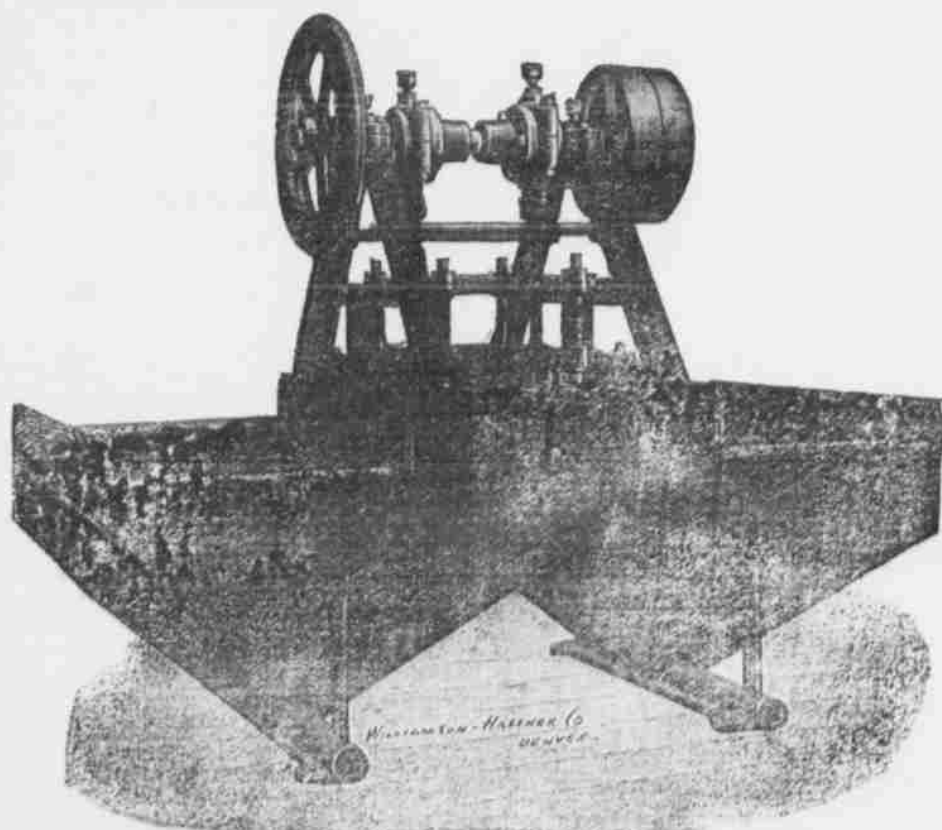

**Wm. Bennett Instantly Killed.**  
Wednesday afternoon about two o'clock Wm. Bennett of London, Mass., who has been working for about a month for the Chambers Lumber Co., at Dorena was killed while in the woods. He was working just across a little hillock, and the rest of the crew were felling trees. When one started to crack about two they called to him and a little later when it began to fall they called to him again and supposed he had gotten out of the way all right, and went on with their work. Later a man went to see him and could not find him and supposed he had gone away, but when going again and not finding him, called the men, and one chanced to see his hat, and then found his body under the top of the tree which had cracked off in its fall, and had crushed him instantly to death.
