If the car shortage does not get better within a short time Cottage Grove will face a shut down of the mills. When the mills are running under ordinary circumstances they employ about 300 men, in the mills and woods, who receive about \$55,000 per month. The men at the mills average from \$2.50 to \$3.50 per day, while in the woods the wages vary from \$1.75 to \$3, and it is conservatively estimated that they earn about \$60 per month. Several of the mills are about to shut down, some already have done so and the difference is already being felt in the stores and in shipments of supplies.

Sixty five persons were present and voted, the vote being 40 for and 25 against the tax.
