"Faith and Character."

There is an intimate relationship between faith and character. Man may try to develop character without faith but the well rounded character is rooted and grounded in faith. In the 7th chapter of Romans the inspired writer describes the condition of the natural man as he is swept along by the passions of his nature and the storm of his desires until he cries out, "Oh wretched man that I am, who shall deliver me from the bondage of this death," and character built on such a basis has very alternated proportions and shrinks into ill-fitting garments. But when faith lays hold on God character grows into a well rounded personality. It is the men and women that have characters built upon faith in God that today are moulding the destiny of the age that is yet to be.

Faith and character are inseparably connected and as the one develops the other grows strong. It is by faith that we come out of the shadows and ascend to the sunlit heights of belief in God, have fellowship with Christ and communion with the Holy Ghost and character with such intimate relationship will be felt for good and will rise above the petty persecutions and lay a firm hand on opposition and assert itself for the right.

Character becomes like the object of the faith on which it is founded. Faith founded on sensualism produces sensual characters and faith that is based on materialism will produce selfish character. But faith in God produces strong, noble, moral manhood, and the student of history is not surprised at the heroic spirit that marked the characters of the early church. Christian faith produces self-sacrificing, forgiving characters. This spirit made the church efficient in every age.
