TO INCREASE NATIONAL GUARD.

Within the next few weeks the Oregon National Guard will be enlarged to two regimental organizations, instead of one regiment and one battalion, as at present. This announcement was made by Adjutant-General W. E. Finzer, of the O. N. G.

At present the Third Regiment has its full quota of 12 companies recruited to the standard peace footing of 65 enlisted men each, but there is at present but one additional battalion of militia.

This new company is already being organized at Peedleston, and four more will be organized and lo-

cal at various towns and cities of the state, though the exact places where they will have not been determined upon. The Military Board having recently decided on increasing the standing of the Guard, has been engaged for some time on this matter, and three towns out of the four have practically been decided upon, partly because of their location and partly because it has been thought they had first call on new companies whenever it should be thought best to form them.

The three cities already selected are Oregon City, Cottage Grove and McMinnville and there is such keen rivalry for the honor of being the home of the fourth company that the Military Board is having some difficulty in making a selection. It is said that Silverton will probably win the prize.

When these companies have been organized the Oregon National Guard will have the following standing: One 12-company regiment, the Third; one eight-company regiment, the Fourth; one battery, light artillery, and one hospital corps.
