The Portland Journal in speaking of the probable abandonment of the proposed Eugene-Corvallis canal, ends the article by saying, "If Eugene sets her face toward the Willamette and constantly hammers away, water transportation will come and comparatively soon," in other words intimating that the Willamette river can be used to transport the products of this section to Portland.

Whether this is possible or not, the Nugget would still suggest that the project of connecting by electric road at Albany with the Corvallis road to Yaquina at least receive the attention of the committee who lately reported adversely to the canal scheme, and which meets again in Eugene in the near future.

As we understand it, it is not the particular aim of the people of Eugene and we will say of Lane county, to find transportation particularly to Portland, but to find some means by which its products can be transported to market, more especially to markets outside of the state of Oregon for instance, San Francisco, and this can be done cheaper and better by reaching Yaquina via Corvallis.

The writer, however, does not claim to have made such investigations of this scheme as would warrant him in asserting that it is entirely feasible, but is merely echoing the statements that are promulgated by many of our old citizens and residents. To be able to ship our products to San Francisco via Yaquina in preference to Portland means a saving of several hundred miles, and in fact we can see no reason, if this route is established that Portland can expect to handle the transportation as the extra distance to move the products would be from here to Portland, thence 125 miles to the ocean and down the coast the same distance as from here to Portland, in order to reach the port which we have right at our door as may be said. A railroad is already in operation from Yaquina to Albany, which would only leave the distance from Cottage Grove to Albany to be spanned.

Whatever may be the result of the agitation, even if it amounts to nil, the credit of the effort must be given to Eugene people, who have and are making every effort to secure transportation at rates that will leave the producer a fair price for his products and not at the mercy of a corporation and we believe that we speak for this section of the county when we say that whatever the promoters think is most feasible and best method to obtain what they are striving for, will receive the hearty co-operation of this section and if an electric road is decided on that Cottage Grove will have the opportunity of deciding whether or no, it desires to be counted in on the deal.

It now shows, as was thought by every thinking citizen here was something back of it.

If Messrs. Palmer and Storey would like to come to Cottage Grove they would surely be welcomed as heartily as fortunate Eugene has welcomed them.

We do not believe that they expect Eugene to build their railroad to timber, nor do we think for a minute any obstruction will be given them in reaching their vast holdings of timber land in the vicinity of Cottage Grove. It is quite evident that if they were driven from Cottage Grove, they told their secrets to the wrong people.

The same publication is giving the story of the change in affairs of the Oregon Securities Company, state that during the past four months while the mine was in the custody of the receiver, it has been operated at a profit. This may be true, but if so, it looks bad and it is a poor way to boost. The company was managed during the receivership by the same management as before, and such statements only go to distrust the former stockholders, and make it unpleasant for the management of the new company, and it also works a hardship on the mining industry, and such reports and such works continually keep a cloud over Bohemia.

Sunday afternoon May 26, the gentle spirit of Ida Saxton McKinley took flight from this earth, to join that of her martyred husband in the world beyond. Even the Angel of Death felt compassion for one who in life had suffered so much both mentally and bodily, for it came while Mrs. McKinley was peacefully resting to a life of well doing.

Mrs. McKinley was born in Canton, Ohio, June 8, 1847, and was married to William McKinley January 25, 1871. The shock of the death of her two daughters and her mother within a year was so great that her health was shattered and from that time on her life was one of suffering borne with uncomplaining patience.

Even her invalidism could not destroy her indomitable spirit nor her faith in her husband, and it was her wise counsel and unflinching belief in his future that kept William McKinley's courage in dark hours of adversity and finally enabled him to achieve the goal of his ambition—the presidency of the United States.

The bullet which killed her husband came near causing the death of Mrs. McKinley and for a long time her life was despaired of and she wished at that time to join her husband. On her recovery however, she wished to live until the completion of the McKinley mausoleum erected by the nation which will be dedicated September 30.

The funeral was held Wednesday and was attended by the President and many prominent officials.
