

INCREASED COST.

The Expense of Publishing Newspapers Greatly Increased.

Like everything else, the cost of publishing a newspaper has increased. A dozen or so years ago the getting out of a paper was comparatively inexpensive. Help was cheap, paper stock was low, and less reading matter was required. Today printers get sixty per cent more in wages than they got twelve years ago and another increase is to go into effect September 1. The price of paper stock has risen fully a third and is still rising.

The introduction of the linotype into newspaper offices was felt to be the downfall of compositors, but time has shown that there are more men and women at work today on newspapers than ever before. The reason is that newspapers give more for the money than formerly. Give more reading and a larger and better paper in every way than was the case in former years.
