

TO TEST DEMURRAGE LAW

McKinley Mitchell Orders Freight Car --Railroad Will Refuse in Time-- To File Test Case.

McKinley Mitchell, a Portland shipper, has ordered a freight car from the Southern Pacific railroad company in order to test the validity of the demurrage law enacted by the last legislature.

Still Pays to Advertise.

The Marshfield Chamber of Commerce advertising was started one week ago Sunday in several of the large eastern daily papers.

The Clatsop county assessor will raise timber lands 25 to 33 per cent and next year to full value.

Will Probably Not Pick Hops.

Colonel George O. Moran, who is one of the principal hop growers of this section, says he has about concluded not to pick his crop of hops this year, and thinks if the entire Willamette Valley, or in fact the whole Pacific Coast would conclude to do the same thing, the hop business would be placed on a better basis.

"The hop market is the most prolific source of gambling and juggling, to the detriment of the grower, of any other product of the soil. There are a great number of middlemen now who have the hop crop of 1907 sold to the brewers who use them, at ridiculously low prices, and will therefore be compelled to pay the grower a very low price in order to make good."

"My hops are better this year than they have ever been before, and it seems a shame to let them stay on the vine, but I'm afraid they won't pay for the picking, so that I have almost concluded not to pick. If all hop growers could agree up a policy of this kind, something might be done, but under existing conditions things look quite blue for the business."
