## FIRST CONTRACT ON CELILO CANAL

Washington, D. C., Aug. 9.—Smyth & Jones, of Portland, will build the first segment of the Dalles-Celilo canal on the Upper Columbia River.

The Acting Secretary of War has directed that the contract be awarded this firm, it being the lowest bidder who entered into the recent competition at Portland, its price being \$204,261.70.

When the contract is formally closed between this firm and the Government, and the contractors furnish a bond to the Secretary of War, to guarantee satisfactory completion of the work, the firm will be expected to concentrate its plant and force of laborers at or near Celilo and commence actual construction as soon as possible. Under the terms of the contract, the work must be completed by December 31, 1906.
