As there is no conspiracy law on the statute books of Oregon, E. E. Radding and Mrs. Rose Waymir cannot be prosecuted on this charge. That there was a plot to destroy the reputation of Mayor Harry Lane, and that Radding and the Waymir woman were instruments, if not the actual plotters, is generally conceded by the public. The prosecution says the fact that there was such a conspiracy was clearly proved in the hearing held in the Municipal Court last week, but inasmuch as Oregon has no law covering the case Radding and the woman will have to be dealt with under some other section of the code.
