COUNTY SEAT NEWS AND NOTES

Democratic Central Committee Meeting. M. Doyle Gets \$45,000. O. F. Callison out for Clerk. Booze Sellers Fined.

The Eugene city council appropriated \$500 this week for the improvement of the city park.

A Commercial club was organized at Junction this week, the membership fee was placed at \$5.

The work of moving the freight depot will begin tomorrow. The foundation in the new passenger depot was put in today.

Fred Lemley was sentenced Friday morning to pay a fine of \$300 for selling liquor at Springfield in violation of the local option law.

E. J. McClanahan is now employing five men in his incubator factory on West Eighth street. He has quite a plant there, the machinery being operated by electricity.

Clyde Woolwine, who had previously pleaded guilty to the charge of fornication, was sentenced by Judge Harris of the Circuit court to serve six months in the county jail and to pay the costs of the prosecution.

P. E. Snodgrass, Luke L. Goodrich and Chas. L. Scott, appraisers in the estate of the late Norman A. W. Howe of Creswell have filed their inventory and appraisal in the probate court showing property, mostly in notes and real estate, which they value at \$19,765.13.

A. C. Mathews has been engaged to do the excavating necessary for the cellar and foundation for a fine three-story brick building to be constructed this spring and summer by George T. Hale, Sr., on his lot facing Pearl street on the east and reaching clear through to East Park street.

Governor Chamberlain will be in Eugene on March 17 to present the colors to the new fourth regiment. There will be public exercises in the armory and the governor will make the presentation speech. This is the evening on which the band will give a concert, but arrangements will be made whereby the presentation can be made after the concert.

A meeting of the Lane County Democratic central committee is called to meet in the county court room at Eugene, Saturday March 14 at 10 o'clock a. m. to which all democrats are invited. Gardner. Plans for the coming campaign will be formulated. Lee M. Traxis is chairman of the Democratic central committee.
