COUNTY SEAT NEWS AND NOTES

Legislative Candidates Galore---Some for Statement No. 1; Some Oppose it---Other News.

A number of the men are overhauling the Eugene Woolen mill preparatory to starting up about the first of April.

The big boiler for the Elmira Lumber Company's mill was unloaded from the car Monday and placed on a wagon preparatory to taking it out to the mill.

N. H. Martin of Cottage Grove, was appointed administrator of the estate of Nathaniel Martin, who died January 9, 1908. The estimated value of the property of the estate is \$1500. W. F. Hart, John Allen and N. P. Chrisman were appointed appraisers.

Allen Eaton, who was a member of the legislature two years ago has also filed his petition for re-election and signs Statement No. 1. Crow and Eaton are the only Statement No. 1 republicans yet to announce themselves in this county for legislative honors.

It was reported on the streets Saturday that Andy Taylor, who was sentenced to pay a fine of \$300 and to serve thirty days in the county jail for violation of the local option law, had disappeared, but he was found about 7:30 o'clock after a search for him by officers. He has begun to serve his sentence. The Jap hotel porter has also begun to serve his term in jail.

The University of Idaho debating team Thursday defeated that of the University of Oregon securing a two to one decision from the judges. The question discussed was "Resolved, That the present laws relating to the admission of Chinese immigrants into the territory of the United States be extended to Japanese immigrants." The Oregon team upheld the affirmative of the argument, and the Idaho trio had the negative side.

W. W. Calkins of this city, has announced his candidacy for the Republican nomination for representative from Lane county. When asked if he favored Statement No. 1 he replied: "No, I am not in favor of Chamberlain for United States senator and I would not want to be placed in a position where I would have to vote for him." Mr. Calkins is at present a member of the Eugene city council, is United States commissioner and is a practicing attorney.

The notarial commission of Ernest Parvance of Disston, was filed with the county clerk Thursday.

Primary election supplies were received by County Clerk Lee this morning and they will be distributed to the different precincts at once.

The city council held an adjourned session Tuesday at which time the Warren Construction company's bid for paving East Eleventh street from Willamette street to the S. P. railroad for \$2.72 per square yard was accepted.

Father Fitzpatrick of Cottage Grove took occasion to solicit bids for his new residence for which Architect John Hunzicker drew the plans and which he hopes to be able to build soon. He will get bids from Cottage Grove builders also.—Register.

Charles J. Barhite has sold his brick building on Willamette street just across the alley from the Hotel Smeede, to Mr. Smith, who resides on West Fourth street, the purchase price being \$7500. This building is occupied by a short order restaurant on the lower floor and office rooms on the second floor.

J. A. J.
