COUNTY SEAT NEWS AND NOTES

Crystal Consolidated Receivership--Twin Rock Mining Co., Incorporated--Child Burned to Death--Over 5000 Registered.

Work commenced on the new First National bank building Tuesday.

Once more the Warren Construction company is laying its bituminous paving on Eugene's streets, and inside of two weeks, providing the weather remains good, East Eighth street, from Willamette to High, will be covered with a splendid hard-surface pavement, the same as on Willamette street.

Lewis Hartley, W. B. Bartley, S. R. May, George B. Splitter, W. I. Winkings, T. H. Willsher and A. C. White, as the board of directors, have filed articles of incorporation for the Twin Rocks Gold Mining and Milling company. They make the principal place of doing business Cottage Grove instead of as formerly at Corvallis and the capital stock is increased to \$1,500,000 and the business is the usual mining and milling business. The original articles of incorporation were filed February, 1904.

S. F. Jackson came in from Lorane Monday and brought in some excellent samples of the coal he has found on his place in Lorane precinct. The outcrop of the vein is only three or four inches, but is coal of a good quality and it was along the bed of the creek for a half mile. It is thought by going deeper the vein will widen out and be large enough to pay to work. The coal burns quite freely and is of the bituminous order. If it proves what is expected of it, it will be a great thing for Lane county.

The woolen mill started up Tuesday.

John H. Blattner and Daniel Snapp asked the circuit court for the appointment of a receiver for the Crystal Consolidated Mining Co., which is operating in the Bohemia mining district. They suggest the name of Frank D. Wheeler as a suitable and competent person for the position.

Registration Clerk McFarland will soon complete entry of registrations for the primary election and the total will be about 5,300, or 200 more than for the primaries two years ago. After the primaries election registration books will again be opened and the enrollment will probably reach 6000 for the June election.

The two-year-old daughter of Rev. and Mrs. Kinman, of Mabel, on the Mohawk, was burned to death at the family home Tuesday. Mrs. Kinman was at the barn milking a cow, her husband being away from home. When she returned to the house, she was grief-stricken to find the little girl dead, her dress having caught fire in some manner.

The attorneys for the S. P. company, William D. Fenton, R. A. Leiter and J. M. Pipes, have filed a motion for a new trial in the case of Michael Doyle vs. the S. P. Co., in which plaintiff was recently given a verdict of \$45,000 damages for the loss of both legs. It is now up to the judge to grant or refuse to grant a new trial, when an appeal will probably be taken in either event.
