### New Rifles For Militia—Circus Coming—Sensational Case in Justice Court.

A decree of divorce was granted Saturday in circuit court to Addie M. Clement of Cottage Grove from her husband, John W. Clement.

A marriage license was issued Wednesday to Horace A. Morris, aged 21, a farmer of Waltherville and Miss Carrie Grace Smith, aged 20, a school teacher of Eugene.

Norbert Aya and Wallace Hurlburt went to Saginaw Wednesday where they will put in another "cyclone" feed for the furnaces for the boilers of the Booth-Kelly Lumber Co.

Carl Oglesby and J. L. Furnish left on the early morning train Wednesday for Cottage Grove and will go up the Brumbaugh on a search for timber. They will be gone a week or ten days.

According to the best estimates the hop acreage in Oregon will be about 2,000 less than last year.

The mandates in the dismissal of the liquor cases appealed in the supreme court by Jake Berger and Emil Eitter, were returned to the clerk of the circuit court Wednesday and entered in the circuit court journal. This means that the fine imposed by the circuit court will be duly collected against defendants.

A very sensational affair was aired in the Eugene Justice court Monday in which Maurice Woolwine, Fred Craig, Harvey and Henry Jones and William Twilley together with two young girls figured as principals. The minor to whose delinquency these young men are accused of contributing is Addie Watts, a girl of 16 years, who has been here for some time past and her folks are said to be respectable citizens residing near here. According to the testimony in court, Twilley, Craig, Jones and others drove out to Twilley's place, three miles west of town, with the Watts girl and another girl and spent the night there carousing, drinking and indulging in a most disgraceful debauch. William Twilley and Henry Jones were bound over to the circuit court in the sum of \$500 each in default of which they will be held in jail. The other three young men wanted have not yet been apprehended. The penalty for the offense of which these men are accused is a fine of not more than \$1000 or imprisonment not more than a year.
