Liquor Cases Sustained by Supreme Court---Death of Rev. Sweaney. New Saw Mill Notes.

Frank Bice filed his location on the mining claim which he calls "The Blaine," in the Bohemia district.

The Berger-Bean Hardware company sold to N. E. Blair a 16 horse-power boiler and a 10 horse-power engine for a sawmill at McKenzie Bridge. Rev. Andrew M. Sweaney died at his Eugene home, June 15, 1908. He was born November 11, 1841, in Jackson county, Ind., and moved with his parents to Davis county, Mo., in 1848. He was a soldier in the civil war, enlisting in 1861 and serving during the entire war in the Union army, his service being mostly in Missouri. He united with the Christian church in 1866 and became a minister in that church, being ordained in 1871. He was married to Miss Belle Terry November 11, 1872, at Gallatin, Mo., and as a result of that union eight children were born, of which seven are living; the oldest and two other sons are in Canada, three sons reside at home in Eugene, and the only daughter, Mrs. J. A. Powell resides south of Cottage Grove. Rev. Sweaney moved to Nebraska in 1877, from thence to Washington in 1885, where he was pastor of the First Christian church of Tacoma, which was built during his pastorate. He came to Oregon in 1887 and moved to Canada in 1898, returning to Oregon in 1904. He has three brothers and sisters surviving, one brother and two sisters in Eugene and the others are in Missouri.
