Ex-Sheriff Fisk Caned---Fire Cracker Accident---Bridge Contracts Let. Logging Operations Resumed.

Isaac Howard was down from Cottage Grove yesterday on business. He will shortly take a trip to his old home in Kansas and Missouri, to be gone several months.—Register.

E. C. Hill has the contract for building a half mile of high board fence around the county fair grounds and fifteen horse stalls, combined width of which is 150 feet. Work begins this week.

The county court sat Monday for the purpose of opening the bids for the construction of the two county bridges over Edwards slough about a mile southeast of Junction on the road running east toward the river. The 80-foot span was let to C. W. Thompson, at his bid of \$1,190 and the 50-foot span was let to W. W. Inman and A. Striker for \$860. The bridges are both to be completed and opened for travel by October 1 of this year.

Virgil Ham, the ten-year-old son of J. S. Ham of this city, blew off the thumb and little finger of his right hand Saturday by the premature explosion of a cannon fire cracker. Both the thumb and finger were torn completely off, and the remainder of the hand so lacerated that two bones had to be removed from the palm. The lad, when he saw his injury said "Oh, look at my hand." He stood the accident bravely.
