### SUNDAY CLOSING IS ENFORCED AT ROSEBURG

The Roseburg Review says, regarding the outcome of the Sunday closing cases at Roseburg: The defendants, R. B. Mathews and C. J. Denning, changed their former pleas of "not guilty" and admitted that their respective places of business were open on Sunday, July 19, as alleged in the complaints. Upon agreeing to keep their business places closed on Sundays hereafter until such time as the state law on Sunday closing has been passed upon by some higher court, Justice Long imposed the minimum fine of \$5.00 each, which was promptly paid.

#### OTHER CASES PENDING.

It is generally understood now that a general test of this Sunday closing law will come up before the circuit court, and until that can be done it is probable that Sunday closing will be observed in this city. As to whether one of the cases now pending, or some other, will be thus tried has not yet been decided and of course cannot be told by the officers themselves.

Late this afternoon it was reported that Messrs. Rhoades and Jennings will probably enter pleas of guilty and their cases then taken into the circuit court for a thorough reviewing.
