Cottage Grove was holding the biggest little fair ever given in the state. The people of that city have scored a greater success in the brief time they have been making preparations than they have dreamed of and the enthusiasm of the promoters, coupled with the pride exemplified by the visitors from all about the city points to the Cottage Grove fair becoming an annual event of growing importance.

In spite of the inclement weather Friday brought hundreds of visitors to the pavilion where a variety of exhibits held close attention of the sightseers. The secret of the whole thing is that the citizens, the press, and the people have worked in harmony together in promoting the enterprise and under such circum-

Judges were busy Friday picking out the winners of ribbon prizes and the successful ones will be given to the press in due time.

TO WITHDRAW TRACT OF LAND

The General Land Office has decided to withdraw on January 20, 1909, 91,500 acres from the Umpqua Forest Reserve. This embraces some of the finest dairying, fruit and timber lands in Oregon, being located in Coos and Western Lane and Douglas counties.

The dairying and fruit lands will be subjected to the Homestead act only, but the timber lands will be taken up under the timber and stone law.

One of the peculiar features of this opening is that squatters rights will be recognized. After December 21 persons may settle on the land and prepare to make it their home. The right of such squatters will be recognized as prior to those who file on January 20.

It is expected that there will be a great rush for these lands, owing to the fact that similar land in that section is held at from \$50 to \$300 per acre. The proposed railroad from Drain to Marshfield runs directly through the center of this tract which will be thrown open.

This seems to disprove the charge made against the government that vast areas are being reserved for the benefit of the lumbermen and that bona fide homeseekers are being shut out.
