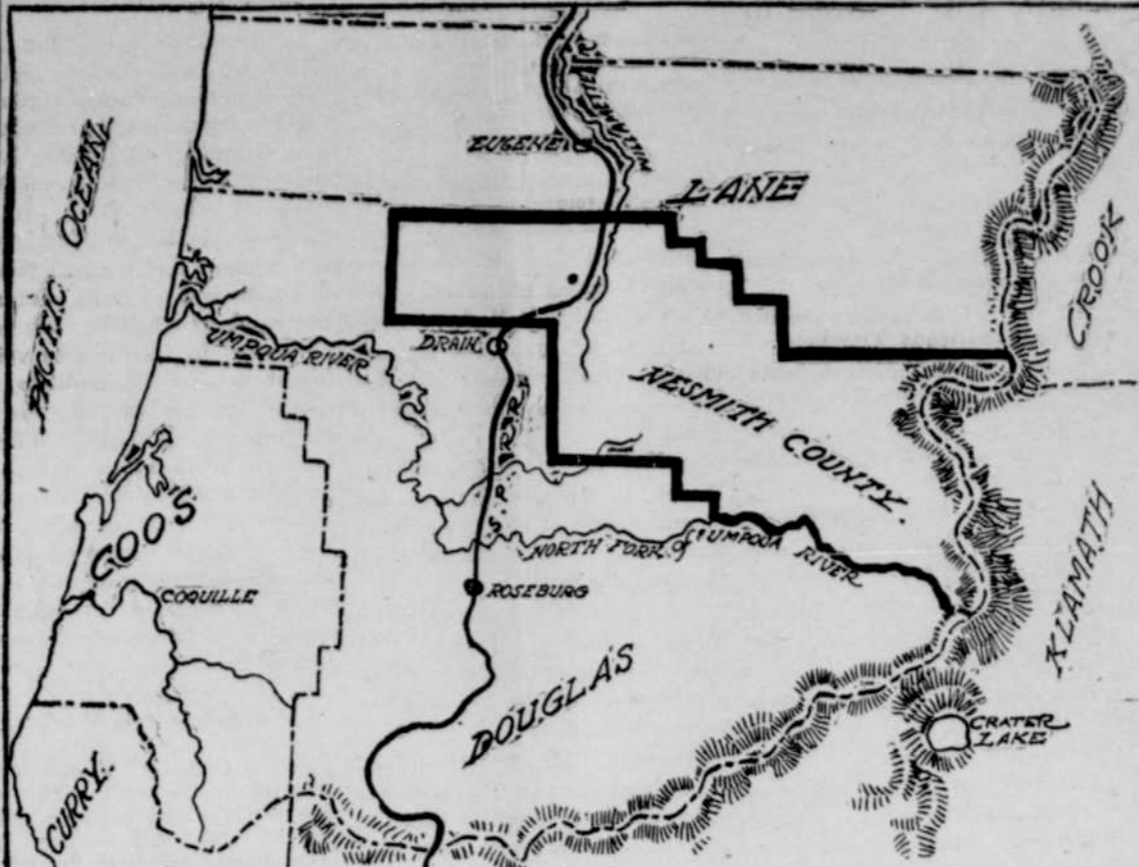

TO COMMENCE BUSINESS MIDDLE OF FEBRUARY

YONCALLA IS OPPOSED TO DRAIN SCHEME

B. W. Strong, Roseburg, has received a letter from a leading business man of Yoncalla, stating that the citizens there are actively opposed to the two county division scheme to be brought before the present session of the legislature. Their opposition is not against the Cottage Grove scheme alone, but against both that and the Drain movement. They have already formulated a remonstrance there, against both scheme, and it is being generally signed. Copies have also been sent to Elkton, Scottsburg, Oakland and elsewhere, requesting similar action at those places, which will doubtless be given. They also ask the support of Roseburg and the county in general, as they do not want to be cut off into a new county, with the inevitable increase of taxation which would follow. The matter has been placed before influential people here and formal protests will probably soon be forthcoming.

FOR THE SMALL DINNER PARTY

The Menu Should be Dainty but Not at all Elaborate.
Dainty china is always desirable but not necessarily costly. In selecting, always choose ware of a delicate transparency, with a pretty flower-like design. It is just as well to use your "company set" only on festive occasions.
A small dinner-party is usually more successful than large and elaborate functions. Where a large number of people are being entertained it is difficult to have every one congenial, while six to ten people—a few old friends and a few new ones—give sparkle to the conversation.
For a formal dinner the invitations should be sent two weeks in advance. The usual hour for a dinner is seven o'clock or seven thirty. The fashionable hour for a very ceremonious dinner is eight o'clock.
One's maid plays an important part in all dinner-giving, and if she be not an expert in the art of cooking it would be well to have several rehearsals of the bill of fare. Make your choice of dishes for the contemplated dinner and then have the maid cook and serve such dishes at the family table once or twice. This will give her confidence and a chance to do herself credit when the time comes.
Where one has just a single servant the dinner should be of the simplest. Raw oysters or grapefruit are easily prepared, a good clear soup, a fish and meat course. The salad can be made beforehand and kept crisp in the refrigerator. A frozen dessert should be chosen, as that can be arranged in advance. Then comes the inevitable black coffee served in after dinner coffee cups. This gives you seven courses. Any ordinary maid can get up this dinner and serve without being too much rushed if the number of guests is limited.—The February NEW IDEA WOMAN'S MAGAZINE.
