THE STEAMSHIP REPUBLIC AND WILLIAM MARCONI, WHOSE WIRELESS TELEGRAPH SAVED 700 LIVES WHEN SHIP SANK AFTER COLLISION.

The name of Marconi was immortalized when the sea was robbed of more than 700 victims by the effectiveness of the wireless telegraph in bringing aid to the sinking White Star steamship Republic off Nantucket, Mass. Fully twenty steamships, revenue cutters and signal stations were apprised of the peril of the Republic an instant after the collision with the Florida through the flashing of the distress signal "C Q D" by the Republic's wireless operator. The steamship Lorraine caught the signal 125 miles away. The Baltic of the White Star line also got the signal and by means of her submarine bells located the sinking ship. Half a dozen other vessels hastened to the scene of the accident. Among these was the revenue cutter Gresham, which did splendid work in transferring the passengers and crew of the Republic to the Florida. Later the Baltic took on board all the passengers of the two vessels and landed them in New York.

OFFICIALLY DECLARED TO LIVE LIKE JESUS

Cleveland, Ohio, Jan. 27.—The two weeks' effort of 1,800 young people of this city to "live as Jesus would live" closed today with a big mass meeting at the Epworth Memorial church.

The Rev. W. B. Wallace declared the test had been a success. Thousands in Cleveland attempted the test, but did not officially join the movement.

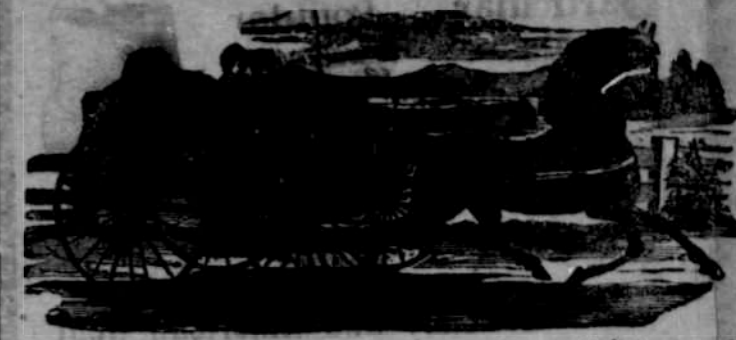
