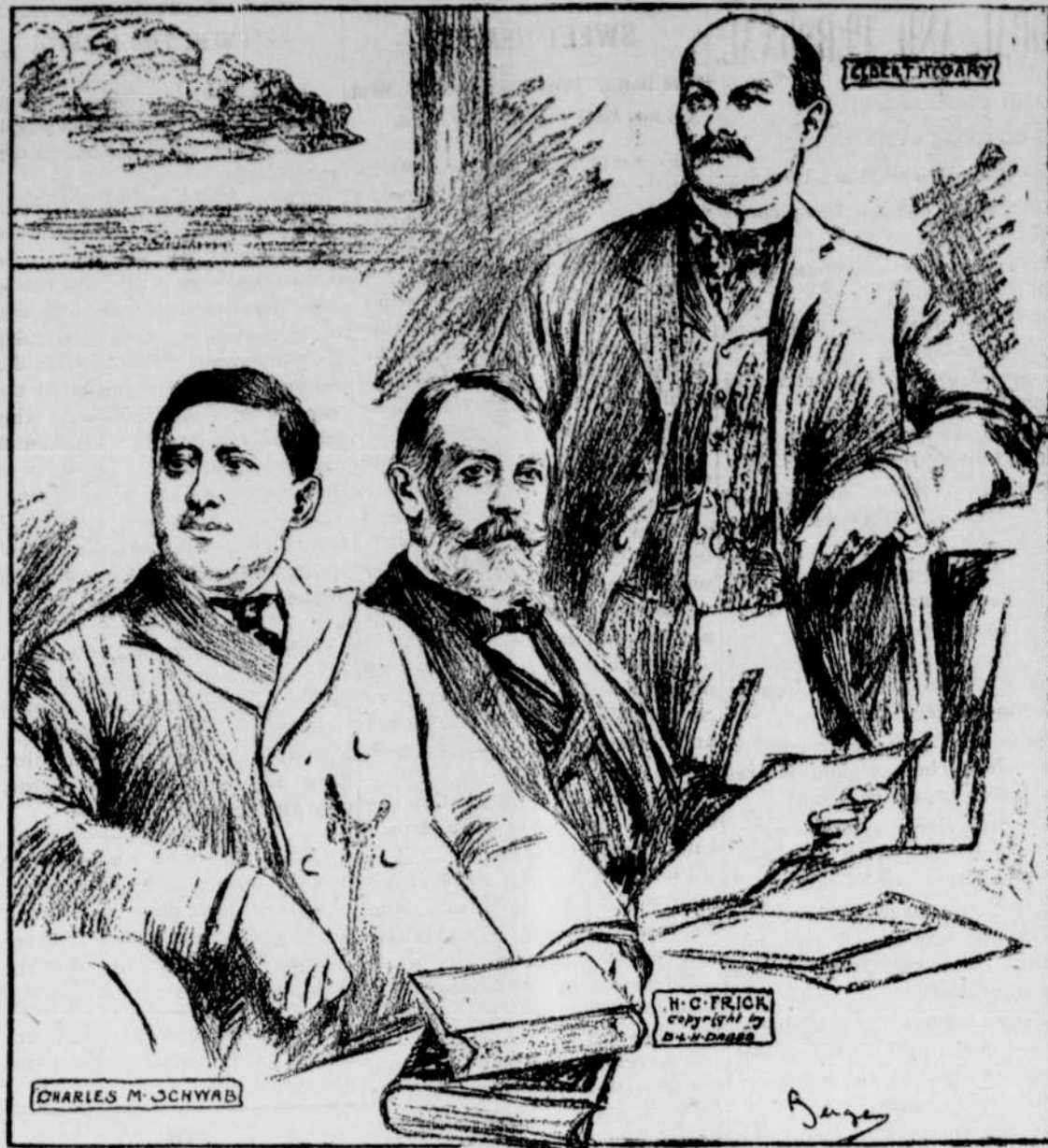

The Judiciary committee of the United States senate in its investigation of the absorption of the Tennessee Coal and Iron company by the United States Steel corporation during the panic of 1907 is likely to summon Charles M. Schwab, E. H. Gary and H. C. Frick. Messrs. Gary and Frick were mentioned by President Roosevelt as being the men who asked him to permit the merger so that the panic might be checked. It has since been stated that the president was misled as to the actual necessity of the merger, and the purpose of the senate investigation is to ascertain just what prompted the transaction.
