WHERE WORLD'S WORKS OF ART WILL BE HOUSED AT A-Y-P. EXPOSITION, SEATTLE.

In this building will be exhibited many priceless paintings. The Fine Arts Building is a fireproof structure and was one of the first buildings completed on the Exposition Grounds. It cost more than \$200,000 to erect the building.
